3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Fingerprinting Requirement

The *Diocese of Youngstown Child Protection Policy* requires "Each applicant for employment or volunteer service in a position with regular contact with children will provide his/her fingerprints in order that a criminal background check may be made."

Pastors, principals and administrators are required to ensure that their employees/volunteers have complied with this provision of the policy, whether they are new to service in the diocese or have been serving our children for many years.

Questions about fingerprinting procedures, or other *Child Protection Policy* questions, may be directed to Nancy Yuhasz at the Chancery Office, 330-744-8451, ext. 235.

B. Webcheck Billing

Persons who are fingerprinted for the Child Protection Policy and request that the parish or school be billed are asked to print or write clearly the name of the parish and city, or the name of the school and city, on the log sheet in order that the proper institution may be billed. Thank you for your cooperation.

Parishes have received the annual Pastoral Survey request in order to track Mass attendance and reception of Holy Communion. Please submit the completed survey to the Chancery Office no later than May 10. Thank you for your cooperation.
