### D. Role of Charitable Organizations in the Political Debate

On June 10, the IRS sent a warning letter to the Republican and Democratic National Committees and to the headquarters of "third party" organizations, such as the Green Party, to remind them that tax-exempt charitable organizations are prohibited from directly or indirectly participating or intervening in any political campaign.

The IRS letter appeared to be in response to news reports that the Bush Campaign had asked religious congregations to distribute campaign literature and to recruit likely Bush supporters to register to vote. As you know, these activities are absolutely prohibited under the tax and elections laws.

While charities may sponsor debates to educate voters and conduct voter registration and get-out-the-vote drives, such activities must be scrupulously non-partisan and not designed to enhance support for any candidate or party. As the IRS letter points out, "even activities that encourage people to vote for or against a particular candidate on the basis of non-partisan criteria violate the political campaign prohibition of section 501 (c) (3).

The IRS letter goes on to remind the campaigns that churches and charities can invite candidates to speak at its events without jeopardizing their tax exempt status as long as they

- \* provide an equal opportunity to other candidates seeking the same office; and
- \* do not indicate in any way support or opposition to any candidate.

Charities can invite political candidates to speak in their non-candidate capacities only if no mention is made (by anyone) of the election or the candidacy and no campaign activity of any kind occurs.

In light of the policies adopted by the U.S. bishops with respect to invitations to politicians who reject Church teaching, it seems important to remind ourselves of the civil law restrictions as well.
