2. OFFICIAL CATHOLIC DIRECTORY UPDATES

Please observe this deadline so that corrections/changes may be made on Chancery forms and we can observe our deadline for submitting the compiled information for the 2006 edition. If you do not receive your annual form in early September please call Nancy Yuhasz at the Chancery.

3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Requirements Reminder

All employees and volunteers who work with children are reminded that they must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program. Some Compliance Checklists are submitted with names but no notation for these two requirements. Some show that persons signed the background questionnaire for the previous Child Protection Policy, but not for the current (2003) Policy. All employees and volunteers must sign the questionnaire, whether or not they work with children. Administrators are reminded that these requirements must be fulfilled for your employees and volunteers.

Diocesan In-Service Days have been scheduled for August and September. Please refer to the Office of Religious Education section below for dates and locations.

B. Compliance Checklist

Persons responsible for submitting the Compliance Checklist to the Chancery are reminded to call or mail when information is updated for employees/volunteers as requirements are completed (see above). If mailing a copy of your original Checklist, please highlight or otherwise identify the changes so we don't go into each record on your list to see what has changed. If information is not updated the data base shows those persons not fully in compliance. Also, please remember to include addresses as there is often more than one person with the same name. G. Catholic Charities Housing Opportunities Needs Your Help

Catholic Charities Housing Opportunities (CCHO) has been awarded a project development grant by the USDA Rural Development to explore the possible implementation of a Mutual Self-Help Housing Program. This program assists low and moderate income families to build their own homes in cooperative fashion. CCHO is in the application stage of this program and is considering possible sites in Ashtabula County. At this time, CCHO is seeking indication of preliminary interest for two staff positions that will be filled if CCHO moves forward with this program. The positions are briefly described below.

Construction Supervisor: This individual will train and supervise program participants in home construction and related activities. Qualifications include: professional construction experience, ability to teach unskilled workers, ability to work with people of varying backgrounds and willingness to work evenings and weekends.

Group Coordinator: This individual will recruit and determine eligibility of potential program participants, assist participants with loan processing, ensure participation of all program participants, and maintain program records. Qualifications include: ability to encourage cooperation among diverse groups, ability to plan and deliver training, knowledge of home financing, ability to maintain organized records, and willingness to work evening and weekends.

The National Directory for Catechesis (NDC) is an official document of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved by the Congregation for the Clergy, according to the norms established in the General Directory for Catechesis, Liberio Editrice Vaticana, 1997. The new NDC replaces Sharing the Light of Faith, The National Catechetical Directory for Catholics of the United States, 1979.

Implementation of the NDC in the Diocese of Youngstown will be accomplished through formation opportunities and resources. The NDC directives will guide revisions of policies and guidelines of the Diocesan Directory for Catechesis, The Diocesan Curriculum for Catechesis, and the review of resources. As with the GDC, the NDC lays the foundational principle that catechesis is an ecclesial act in which all church ministries participate.

The Office of Religious Education will provide formation opportunities on the NDC during ministry year 2005-2006. The document is available through the Office of Religious Education at \$ 16.00 each.

5. Vatican Encourages Blood Donation

When Pope Benedict XVI addressed pilgrims marking World Blood Donor Day on June 14, he said Christians should find inspiration for blood donation in Christ who “redeemed us with his blood.” Cardinal Javier Lozano Barragan, head of the Pontifical Council for Health Care Workers, said there are many reasons to donate blood: the world does not have enough blood to meet medical needs, especially in poorer countries; a sense of solidarity or compassion for the sick; and especially that Christ gave to his disciples a specific mandate to “heal the sick.” He added that giving blood is a concrete way to oppose what church leaders have called the “culture of death.” (CNS, June 13, 2005)

The American Red Cross has asked the Christian community here in northern Ohio, and around the world, to donate blood. To be eligible a donor must be at least 17 years old, weigh at least 110 pounds, be in general good health and provide a valid photo ID upon donation.

1. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has advised the USCCB that Fr. Benedict Van der Putten, whose whereabouts are unknown, has been dismissed from the clerical state and may no longer present himself as a priest or perform any priestly functions. Persons are asked to notify the USCCB if you become aware of his whereabouts.
