H1N1 FLU PRECAUTIONS

There has been much concern over a possible severe flu outbreak and the effect this may have on our liturgical celebrations. The Diocese of Youngstown continues to monitor this issue with local and national health organizations. At the present time there is not a need to mandate adaptations at Mass.

However, as we prepare for the possibility of a severe flu season we are outlining several steps to use now and in the future if needed. At this time we are in stage one. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

1. Procedures Reminder

Employee and volunteer requirements:

- Authorization & Verification; Acknowledgement

All employees and volunteers must receive a copy of the 2008 Child Protection Policy and sign the Authorization and Verification (pg. 35) and Acknowledgement (pg. 36). The signed forms are to be kept on file at the location of service; the date signed is to be noted on the Compliance Checklist and sent to the Chancery. Do not send the signed forms to the Chancery.

- Fingerprinting and In-Service

Employees and volunteers who work with children, regardless of their level of contact with children, must be fingerprinted and participate in the "Treasured Gifts from God" in-service program. Any Webcheck location may be used. Background reports are to be sent to the location of service.

2. Updating Information

Administrators must submit updates for employees and volunteers as they complete child protection compliance requirements (either on the Status Report or copy of Compliance Checklist previously submitted); and must submit all information for new employees and volunteers on the Compliance Checklist.

The "working poor" are those who have experienced reductions in their hours at work and those whose wages have not increased along with the rising cost of living. 2. National Migration Week

They are making some changes beginning with this coming year's NMW, while at the same time keeping some things constant. Regarding consistency, the theme *Renewing Hope, Seeking Justice* is being maintained.

Traditional Resources:

MRS is currently developing a series of resources that can be used in conjunction with National Migration Week. The types of materials being produced will also be similar to material produced in the past. This year MRS is developing a prayer card, a bulletin insert on migrant children and a poster. Information on the traditional materials will be forthcoming in the next couple of weeks. More so this year than in years past, MRS is developing electronic resources that can be used for both educational and liturgical purposes.

Justice for Immigrants Postcard Campaign:

The Justice for Immigrants Campaign of the USCCB plans to launch a nationwide effort to mobilize parishes to advocate for comprehensive immigration reform. This initiative, which will be launched on or near National Migration Week, will take the form of a postcard campaign. Parishes will be encouraged to make pre-printed postcards available to their congregations as a simple mechanism by which to advocate to elected officials.

A group known by the name of "Holy Love Ministries" and also the "Missionary Servants of Holy Love" has been active in Cleveland for several years. Earlier names associated with this group have been "Our Lady Protectress of the Faith Movement," "Project Mercy," and "Mary's House of Prayer." They continue to seek funds to develop their center and support their effort. At the request of the Holy See, Bishop Lennon examined, consulted, and made a judgment on their activities. He has issued a decree stating: the alleged apparitions are not supernatural; clergy are forbidden to celebrate sacraments, and the faithful are admonished to cease gathering, on the site of Holy Love Ministries; the group may not legitimately use the name "Catholic" or represent itself as a Catholic group.
