### 2. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

#### A. Webcheck (BCI) Reports - Important Notice

When using Webcheck somewhere other than the three diocesan sites, employees and volunteers must ask the operator to send the report to their own location of service (parish, school, institution.).

The Chancery is holding several fingerprint reports for persons whom we are unable to identify because they did not follow this procedure. If your parish or school is missing a report please call Nancy Yuhasz at the Chancery Office, 330-744-8451.

#### B. Requirements Reminders

##### 1. Fingerprinting - In-Service - Questionnaire

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted by Webcheck and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

##### 2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer, and consequently non-compliance for the diocese.

Sending the Compliance Checklist will also alleviate the problem of unidentified BCI reports as noted above.

### 3. COUNSELING ASSISTANCE FUND

The Ohio Catholic Bishops, through the Catholic Conference of Ohio, have created a new fund, independent of the Church, to help adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse. The Counseling Assistance Fund is designed to provide counseling or similar mental health services for persons who were sexually abused as minors by clergy or other representatives of the Catholic Church.

The Counseling Assistance Fund is different from existing forms of assistance because it is directed toward persons who are reluctant to contact the Church for help.

## PASTORAL AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

### 1. OFFICE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

#### A. From Steel to Scholars

From Steel to Scholars is a program that promotes excellence, accountability & improvements in school district achievement test scores in the Mahoning Valley and honors the school districts that meet high standards of excellence and improvements in these results.

This year Ursuline High School, Cardinal Mooney High School and John F. Kennedy High School, were honored, along with other public high schools in the area, at a luncheon held on October 25<sup>th</sup> at the Metroplex.

## B. Interdiocesan Staff Meeting

On November 19-21, members of the Office of Catholic Schools met in Columbus with their counterparts from the Catholic dioceses in Ohio. The six superintendents planned the meeting so that participants will have the opportunity to pray together and discuss common issues and concerns. There were several small group sessions in which individuals from each diocese discussed a common topic, the results of which was shared with the entire group. In addition, there was a session in which individuals who have the same job responsibilities met and worked through an agenda which they had created prior to the meeting.

## C. Catholic Schools Week

Catholic Schools Week begins on **Sunday, January 28<sup>th</sup> and ends Friday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>**. The theme for this year is: *The Good News in Education*. Catholic Schools Week kicks off registration for the 2007-2008 school year for our Catholic schools. Students and staff also spend time each day celebrating the week in a special way. Below are a few suggestions as to how to celebrate each day of Catholic Schools Week. These suggestions are taken from the Marketing Handbook by the National Catholic Education Association and The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. 2006.

**Sunday:** The Good News in Education: In Our Parish. Mass is the foundation of parish life. Celebrate the Eucharist with parents, guardians, parishioners, prospective students and neighbors. Provide an Open House after the Mass.

**Monday:** The Good News in Education: In our Community. Expand your school's horizons by; honoring community service, inviting a civic leader to your school, support a soup kitchen, volunteering in local programs that provide tutoring in literacy to immigrant or educationally disadvantage residents.

**Tuesday:** The Good New in Education: In Our Students. Our students are the reason Catholic education exists. Make Tuesday special for them. Have a theme day, career day, game day, or spirit day. Honor special achievement, share a treat, or go on an outing.

**Wednesday:** The Good New in Education: In Our Nation. This is a day to remember the vital role that Catholic schools have played in American civic life. Encourage local officials to recognize Catholic Schools Week. Send notes and special care packages to our men and women overseas.

**Thursday:** The Good News In Education: In Our Vocations. Plan your day by learning about religious life, learn about other ways to serve the church, arrange a cathedral visit, or support seminarians by writing letters of appreciation. Check out the new diocese website for vocation information.

**Friday:** The Good News in Education: In Our Faculty, Staff & Volunteers. End CSW with a National Teacher Appreciation Day to honor your dedicated teachers. February 2nd is Candlemas Day, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord and the day the church candles are blessed. Schedule Mass and light a candle for each staff member, hold an appreciation breakfast, recognize volunteers, and/or give small tokens of appreciation.

## D. Partnership Between the Diocese of Youngstown and Walsh University

In partnership since 2004 with the Diocese of Youngstown, Walsh University offers all current full-time Youngstown Diocesan employees a 60% tuition discount. ##### C. Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24, 2006

The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on December 24, 2006. This certainly raises concerns with regard to the liturgical environment and scheduling of Masses. Some parishes may decide to eliminate their last Mass on Sunday morning particularly if it is at a later hour.

In regard to the liturgical environment: Some advance planning will be necessary in order for the integrity of the Advent Sunday to be preserved to some degree, and yet for the parish to be prepared for the Vigil celebrations which follow later in the day. The parish environment and art committee could consider placing a number of elements like trees (with light unlit), wreaths, and the crèche without the Holy Family figures before the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and then completing the environment with poinsettias and the remaining decorative elements.

##### D. Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, January 1, 2007

The obligation to participate in Mass is abrogated for this Solemnity since it falls on a Monday. It is recommended that the faithful still be given the opportunity to celebrate the holy day.

##### E. Time for the Easter Vigil

The Easter Vigil will be **April 7, 2007**. Sunset that evening will be 7:54 p.m. in the Diocese of Youngstown with the end of civil twilight at 8:22 p.m. The Sacramentary reminds us that "The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil takes place at night. It should not begin before nightfall..." In the Diocese of Youngstown, the Vigil should not begin before 8:00 p.m. Starting at 8:30 p.m. or later will ensure complete darkness.
