3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Policy Applies to All Employees and Volunteers

Reminder: The Diocese of Youngstown Child Protection Policy applies to all employees and volunteers in our parishes, schools and institutions, whether or not you work with children. Everyone must read the policy and sign the questionnaires. Additionally, those who work with children must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program.

B. Webcheck at Other Locations

As stated earlier, employees and volunteers who are using Webcheck at a location other than the three diocesan sites must contact the Chancery with your name and the location where you perform your ministry, and the Webcheck location where you will be fingerprinted. The Webcheck operator must use the Chancery Office address in the "mail to" function. This procedure ensures that your BCI report will be sent to your place of service.

The Chancery Office has received some BCI reports which cannot be identified; therefore we cannot forward the report to the proper location. Administrators who are missing BCI reports should contact the Chancery to see if the unidentified reports belong to your employees/volunteers.

C. Compliance Update

In keeping with a commitment to "openness and transparency," the diocese has issued our second Update on compliance with the USCCB *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. This document describes the results of the second USCCB compliance audit, the ongoing efforts for protection of children, and the process for the revision of the *Charter*. A copy of the Update is enclosed with this issue of *Communique*.

D. Compliance Checklist

Persons responsible for submitting the Compliance Checklist to the Chancery are reminded to mail or call when information is updated for employees/volunteers as requirements are completed, e.g., fingerprint check or in-service participation. Otherwise the data base shows those persons not fully in compliance.
