### 2. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

#### Requirements

#### 1. Fingerprinting and In-Service

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

#### 2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer.

#### 3. Webchecks at Other Locations

If using a Webcheck site other than the three diocesan sites, please call the Chancery at 330-744-8451, ext. 235, with name and location of service to ensure that your BCI report is forwarded to the proper location.

## DEPARTMENT OF CANONICAL SERVICES

### Tribunal

Since May of 2004, the Tribunal staff has made available an ongoing, in-service for pastors, associates, deacons, religious, directors of religious education, religious education coordinators and counselors in order to prepare them in facilitating pleas for nullity for persons within the community whose marriages have broken down and who may be seeking a second union recognized by the Church. The in-service focuses on preparation of case histories, compilation of documents, witnesses and determining of the appropriate grounds of nullity.

The response to the ongoing, in-service program has been encouraging. Eight sessions have been held since their inception and approximately 75 registrants have had the opportunity to participate. Size of the in-service is in small groups of between 8-12 participants and generally runs approximately two hours. The in-service is offered at either the offices of the Tribunal of the Diocese of Youngstown or at a parish in the Canton area. Currently several additional registrants are needed to fill another class in both the Youngstown and the Canton area. The Tribunal will contact any remaining registrants when the class quota has been met and another date has been set.

The USCCB has been advised of an apparently fraudulent fundraising scheme being perpetrated by Joseph D. Mshoro who claims to be a priest and to be seeking funds on behalf of the Diocese of Geita (Tanzania) and the Tanzania Episcopal Conference, to defray educational expenses of Mr. Mshoro himself. The Bishop of Geita has confirmed that these appeals are fraudulent, that Mshoro is not a priest, that he does not represent the Tanzania Episcopal Conference, and that he has made a number of appeals forging the Bishop's signature. As always, be extremely careful in responding to requests for funds purporting to be from other dioceses or church-related activities.
