First Step for Change

Suggested Bulletin/Pulpit Announcements



May 7-8, 2005

Beginning this Mother's Day weekend, our parish will be participating in *First Step for Change*, a project sponsored by the Diocesan Office of Pro-Life Activities and Catholic Charities to collect spare change to assist low-income pregnant women and families with food, formula, clothing, diapers and other items essential to a child's health, safety and well-being. Each family interested in participating in *First Step for Change* is asked to pick up a baby bottle (MENTION WHERE THE BOTTLES ARE LOCATED) after Mass. Take the bottle home and put it in a common location (on the kitchen table, on the counter, by the telephone, etc.) and fill it with spare change during the month of May. The process is similar to the Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl campaign. The weekend of June 4-5, 2005, you will be asked to bring your filled bottle to church with you for collection. Remember: the bottles need to be returned so that they do not have to be purchased again next year.

May 14-15

This weekend, you are reminded to pick up a *First Step for Change* bottle (IF THEY ARE STILL AVAILABLE; IF THERE ARE NO MORE BOTTLES LEFT, SUGGEST THAT FAMILIES USE SOME OTHER CONTAINER TO COLLECT SPARE CHANGE) if you still wish to participate in this project. The funds collected through this effort will be used to help low-income mothers-to-be give their children a healthy start in life. If an expectant mother does not have access to food, shelter, clothing and essential items— like cribs or car seats— her baby is at-risk from the very beginning. Take home a bottle today, fill it with spare change, and make a difference in the lives of low-income pregnant women and families with small children.

May 21-22

One way to support the Catholic Church's pro-life, pro-family position is to participate in *First Step for Change*, a project sponsored by the Diocesan Office of Pro-Life Activities and Catholic Charities to collect spare change to assist low-income pregnant women and families with food, formula, clothing, diapers and other items essential to a child's health, safety and well-being. OPERATION RICE BOWL GRANTS

DIOCESE OF YOUNGSTOWN

I. Criteria for Awarding Rice Bowl Grants

- A. Rice Bowl monies are available for groups or organizations who provide food distribution for those in need. Applications for other than food distribution will not be considered.
- B. Economic factors and population of an area are used to determine the size of the grant.
- C. Preference will be given to the inclusion of all counties or geographical areas in the Diocese of Youngstown.

- II. Grants are made in units of \$100. The number of units granted will be determined by the Criteria for Awarding Rice Bowl Grants above.

NOTE: In previous years, grants were made to between 45-50 food programs in a given year. The grants ranged from \$200 to \$700 with most of them being \$200 or \$300.

May 1, 2005 (6th Sunday of Easter)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

Those who obey the commandments, Jesus says in today's Gospel, are the ones who really love Him. Does my stewardship reveal my love for Jesus?

May 8, 2005 (7th Sunday of Easter)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

In today's Gospel, Jesus prays, "I have given You glory on earth by finishing the work You gave Me to do." Good stewards follow His example by using their time and talents for the glory of God.

May 15, 2005 (Pentecost)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

In the second reading today, St. Paul reminds the Corinthians, "There are different gifts, but the same Spirit; there are different ministries but the same Lord." How am I using my gifts "for the common good"?

May 22, 2005 (Holy Trinity)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

The Gospel today is sometimes called "the Gospel in miniature" because it so concisely sums up the Gospel message. In even more condensed form, "God loved...God gave..." it is the paradigm for stewardship—we give because we love.

May 29, 2005 (Body and Blood of Christ)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

The Scriptures today remind us that "we, many though we are, are one body for we all partake of the one loaf." How are we using our gifts of time and talent to build up the body of Christ?

June 12, 2005 (11th Sunday in Ordinary Time)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends out the disciples to meet the needs of others. His admonition to them is the same challenge he makes to us: "Without cost you have received, without cost you are to give."

June 5, 2005 (10th Sunday in Ordinary Time)
STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

In today's Gospel Jesus says to Matthew the tax collector, "Follow me," and Matthew got up and followed Him. Jesus calls each of us by name and invites us to follow Him. Do we hear the Lord's call? Do we follow the disciples path?

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

May 2005: Bulletin Briefs

Civil progress cannot derive from the social devaluation of marriage and from the loss of respect for the inviolable dignity of human life. What appears as the progress of civilization and scientific conquest, in many cases is, in fact a defeat for human dignity and society.

Pope John Paul II, Message to Italy's Forums of Family Association, December 19, 2005

Human life is a precious gift to be loved and defended in each of its stages. The Commandment "You shall not kill!" always requires respecting and promoting human life, from its beginning to its natural end. It is a command that applies even in the presence of illness and when physical weakness reduces the person's ability to be self-reliant. If growing old, with its inevitable conditions is accepted serenely in the light of faith, it can become an invaluable opportunity for better comprehending the Mystery of the Cross, which gives full sense to human existence.

Pope John Paul II, Message for Lent 2005

In making me live an extraordinary experience of love, Emmanuel taught me the beauty of life and the possibility it represents.

He taught me the power of this gratuitous love, wholeheartedly given without asking anything in return. It has enabled me to discover fullness, and this has made me profoundly happy, despite the fact that still today I grieve over his absence.

Thanks to him, I have discovered the limits of our world, my frailty and our immense need. Life is relationship with others; we are responsible for this relationship, above all when the other is nearing death.
