B. Recording Confirmation

Pastors where the sacrament of Confirmation has been celebrated are reminded that they must send the information regarding the place and date of Confirmation to the church of Baptism for each of those confirmed. If Confirmation takes place in the same church as Baptism, the notation is also to be made on the Baptismal record in addition to the separate record of Confirmation. It is also helpful to note the place and date of Baptism on the appropriate Confirmation records.

2. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Audit Report

On January 6 a report will be released in Washington, DC, which indicates how well dioceses are implementing the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The *Charter's* 17 articles or statements of action are divided into four main goals:

- To promote the healing and reconciliation with victims/survivors of child sexual abuse of minors
- To guarantee an effective response to allegations of sexual abuse of minors
- To ensure the accountability of the *Charter's* procedures
- To protect the faithful in the future

The audits were conducted through the USCCB Office of Child and Youth Protection. The Diocese of Youngstown completed our audit in August. We were found to be in complete compliance, with three commendations.

B. Webcheck Billing

Although it is preferred that payment be made when fingerprinting takes place, if the institution is to be billed, employees and volunteers are reminded to note on the log sheet whether it is the parish, or the school, that is to be billed. It is especially important to note in which city the parish or school is located, since some parish names are found in more than one city.

3. OFFICE OF PRO-LIFE ACTIVITIES

A. Day of Penance and Prayer

In all the dioceses of the United States, **January 22** will be observed as a particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. The Mass for Peace and Justice should be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observation for this day. See the Office of Worship, below, for more information.

B. March for Life

On Thursday **January 22**, 2004, thousands will gather in prayer in our nation's capital for the 31st annual March for Life and to protest the 1973 Supreme Court decision denying protection under law to unborn persons. A. Calendar Advisory

January 22 – A Day of Penance and Prayer

In November, 2001, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved an adaptation of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. Following confirmation by the Holy See in February, 2002, the following became particular law for the dioceses of the United States of America:

In all the dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when the 22nd falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. The Mass “For Peace and Justice” (no. 21 from “Masses for Various Needs”) should be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observance for this day.

On January 22, 2004, a “day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life” will be mandatory in the dioceses of the U.S. As an “Optional Memorial,” the Mass celebrated that day may be the Mass “For Peace and Justice” or follow the normal weekday Mass readings and prayers for the day found in the *Ordo*, with or without optional prayers related to St. Vincent of Saragossa whose Feast Day falls on January 22.

Further suggestions for the celebration of the Eucharist on January 22 will be sent to all priests of the diocese early in January.
