3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Webchecks at Other Locations

Persons who use Webcheck at a location other than the diocesan sites (see December *Communique*) are reminded they must use the following procedure:

- ✓ Call the Chancery Office, identifying name and parish, school or institution where ministry is performed, and location of the Webcheck being used. This will ensure that BCI&I reports are forwarded to the proper location when received at the Chancery.
- ✓ Ask the Webcheck operator to use the "mail to" function in order that the Chancery Office receives the result of the background check. Use only this address in the "mail to" function: Chancellor, Diocese of Youngstown, 144 W. Wood Street, Youngstown, OH 44503.

The Chancery Office is receiving BCI reports for persons who have not called ahead to identify themselves. If these persons are not yet in the diocesan masterfile, or if there is more than one person in the masterfile by that name, the Chancery cannot forward the BCI report to the proper location.

If parishes/schools/institutions have not received reports for their employees/volunteers who were recently fingerprinted through Webcheck at another location, call the Chancery Office. That report may have been received but service location unidentified.

B. Compliance Checklist

Some parishes/schools/institutions have not yet submitted a Compliance Checklist. This list is now overdue, and our statistics cannot be compiled until all names are received. If you have not sent your checklist please do so immediately. Please remember to fill in the address for each person, as there may be more than one person with that name.

If the Compliance Checklist was sent, but not all fields filled in, please send updates as Webcheck and in-service training are completed.

4. BINGO APPLICATION

The Catholic Conference of Ohio has notified the Chancery that the Ohio Lottery Commission has mailed a bingo application to all licensed bingo games. License holders can complete the copy received in the mail or go to <http://coin.ag.state.oh.us> and complete the application electronically. In either case, the application must be received by the Lottery Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 3, 2005.

A. Year of the Eucharist

On October 17, 2004, Pope John Paul II solemnly opened the Year of the Eucharist with a Mass celebrated at the 'altar of the *confessio*' in Saint Peter's Basilica and broadcast to the closing of the International Eucharistic Congress in Guadalajara, Mexico. In his homily, the Holy Father asked that the coming year be used to foster and promote "a more keen awareness of the Eucharist, with more deeply felt celebration, with prolonged and fervent adoration, with a greater commitment of fraternity and service to the neediest."

C. Calendar Advisory

In November, 2001, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved an adaptation of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. Following confirmation by the Holy See in February, 2002, the following became particular law for the dioceses of the United States of America:

In all the dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when the 22nd falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. The Mass "For Peace and Justice" (no. 21 from "Masses for Various Needs") should be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observance for this day.

On **January 22**, 2005, a "day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life" will be mandatory in the dioceses of the U.S. As an "Optional Memorial," the Mass celebrated that day may be the Mass "For Peace and Justice" or follow the normal weekday Mass readings and prayers for the day found in the *Ordo*, with or without optional prayers related to St. Vincent of Saragossa whose Feast Day falls on January 22.
