### 3. CHURCH AT HOME COMBINED COLLECTION

The Church at Home Combined Collection was held in parishes of the Diocese of Youngstown the weekend of June 4/5. Because the national dates of these collections are different than the diocesan date, parishes are asked to submit the proceeds as soon as possible.

#### 4. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

##### A. Requirements Reminder

All employees and volunteers who work with children are reminded that they must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program. Some Compliance Checklists are submitted with names but no notation for these two requirements. Some show that persons signed the background questionnaire for the previous Child Protection Policy, but not for the current (2003) Policy. All employees and volunteers must sign the questionnaire, whether or not they work with children. Administrators are reminded that these requirements must be fulfilled for your employees and volunteers.

##### B. Compliance Checklist

Persons responsible for submitting the Compliance Checklist to the Chancery are reminded to call or mail when information is updated for employees/volunteers as requirements are completed (see above). If mailing a copy of your original Checklist, please highlight or otherwise identify the changes so we don't go into each record on your list to see what has changed. If information is not updated the data base shows those persons not fully in compliance. Also, please remember to include addresses as there is often more than one person with the same name. Thank you for your cooperation.

##### C. Webchecks at Other Locations

Employees and volunteers who use a Webcheck other than the three diocesan sites must call the Chancery Office at 330-744-8451, ext. 235, to provide their name and location of service. This will ensure that when the BCI report is received at the Chancery it can be forwarded to the proper location.

### TRIBUNAL

#### In-Service Program

The response to the ongoing, in-service program being offered by the Tribunal staff has been encouraging. Since the in-service became available in May of 2004, seven sessions have been held. An eighth session will be scheduled in early fall. The Tribunal will contact the remaining registrants when this date has been set.

The Tribunal in-service is for pastors, associates, deacons, religious, directors of religious education, religious education coordinators and counselors in order to prepare them in facilitating pleas for nullity for persons within the community whose marriages have broken down and who may be seeking a second union recognized by the Church. The in-service focuses on preparation of case histories, compilation of documents, witnesses and determining of the appropriate grounds of nullity.

Size of the in-service is in small groups of between 8-12 participants and generally runs approximately two hours. The in-service is offered at either the offices of the Tribunal of the Diocese of Youngstown or at a parish in the Canton area.

The National Directory for Catechesis (NDC) is an official document of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved by the Congregation for the Clergy, according to the norms established in the General Directory for Catechesis, Liberio Editrice Vaticana, 1997. The new NDC replaces Sharing the Light of Faith, The National Catechetical Directory for Catholics of the United States, 1979.

Implementation of the NDC in the Diocese of Youngstown will be accomplished through formation opportunities and resources. The NDC directives will guide revisions of policies and guidelines of the Diocesan Directory for Catechesis, The Diocesan Curriculum for Catechesis, and the review of resources. As with the GDC, the NDC lays the foundational principle that catechesis is an ecclesial act in which all church ministries participate.

The Office of Religious Education will provide formation opportunities on the NDC during ministry year 2005-2006. The document is available through the Office of Religious Education at \$ 16.00 each.
