2. BINGO ACCOUNT REVIEW

The Catholic Conference of Ohio recently notified Chancery Offices about a letter which the Attorney General sent to bingo game operators. The CCO stated:

"Some of our bingo games are receiving letters from the Attorney General announcing a review of their bingo operations and related records by personnel from the lottery commission. One of their requests states the following: 'Bank Statements and reconciliations for both the general and bingo accounts.'

In a conversation with Monica Maloney, Senior Deputy, Charitable Law Section on Friday, April 7 she confirmed that the only general church/school account bank statement(s) that are to be reviewed by representatives from the lottery commission are the statements that show the transfer of funds from the bingo account to the general church or school account. It is not necessary for our churches/schools to allow representatives from the lottery commission to review our general church/school bank accounts."

Requirements Reminders

1. Fingerprinting, In-Service, and Questionnaire

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer.

If using a Webcheck site other than the three diocesan sites, please call the Chancery at 330-744-8451, ext. 235, with name and location of service to ensure that your BCI report is forwarded to the proper location.

CANONICAL SERVICES

In-Service Program

Since May of 2004, the Tribunal staff has made available an ongoing, in-service for pastors, associates, deacons, religious, directors of religious education, religious education coordinators and counselors in order to prepare them in facilitating pleas for nullity for persons within the community whose marriages have broken down and who may be seeking a second union recognized by the Church. The in-service focuses on preparation of case histories, compilation of documents, witnesses and determining of the appropriate grounds of nullity.

The response to the ongoing, in-service program has been encouraging. Eight sessions have been held since their inception and approximately 75 registrants have had the opportunity to participate. Size of the in-service is in small groups of between 8-12 participants and generally runs approximately two hours. The in-service is offered at either the offices of the Tribunal of the Diocese of Youngstown or at a parish in the Canton area. Currently several additional registrants are needed to fill another class in both the Youngstown and the Canton area. The Tribunal will contact any remaining registrants when the class quota has been met and another date has been set.

A “non-surgical abortion” facility located near Youngstown has recently opened to dispense the dangerous abortion drug RU-486, also known as “Mifeprex.” The Ohio Women’s Center is located south of the Southern Park Mall at 8162 Market Street. Five American women have died from infections after undergoing RU-486 abortions, and another died from an undiagnosed ruptured ectopic pregnancy. Over 800 others have suffered serious or life-threatening adverse health effects. Women in Canada, Sweden and the United Kingdom have also died after taking RU-486.
