**3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY****A. Webcheck (BCI) Reports - Important Notice**

When using Webcheck somewhere other than the three diocesan sites, employees and volunteers must ask the operator to send the report to their own location of service (parish, school, institution). Catholic school teachers' reports must be sent to the Office of Catholic Schools

The Chancery is holding several fingerprint reports for persons whom we are unable to identify because they did not follow this procedure. If your parish or school is missing a report please call Nancy Yuhasz at the Chancery Office, 330-744-8451.

**B. Requirements Reminders****1. Fingerprinting - In-Service - Questionnaire**

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted by Webcheck and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

## 2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer, and consequently non-compliance for the diocese.

Sending the Compliance Checklist will also alleviate the problem of unidentified BCI reports as noted above.

## 4. LENTEN ABSTINENCE

When scheduling parish events during Lent, groups should avoid Lenten Fridays for luncheons, celebrations, etc., so that dispensation from the abstinence from meat will not need to be requested.

Additionally, please remember that Ash Wednesday (February 21) and Good Friday (April 6) are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday until their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday (Canons 97 and 1252).

The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or substantially, the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

## 5. CHURCH AT HOME COMBINED COLLECTION

This annual collection for the benefit of Catholic Relief Services, Aid to the Church in Eastern Europe, Latin America and Holy Father/Peter's Pence was taken in our parishes the weekend of February 17/18. Because the national collection dates are different from our combined collection date, parishes are asked to send the proceeds of the collection to the Chancery Office as soon as possible.

### 1. OFFICE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

#### Technology Planning

Each Catholic school is in the process of revising its technology plan. Every three years, the Office of Catholic Schools requires each school to submit a plan for approval. The 2006-2007 school year is the end of the current three-year cycle. To assist schools in crafting their plans, personnel from PBS 45/49 will be conducting inservice on March 7 for administrators and technology coordinators. The focus will be on what is new in educational technology and how this technology is a tool in improving student achievement throughout the curriculum. The inservice is part of the benefits our schools share because of their comprehensive membership with PBS 45/49.

A template for the technology plan will also be shared. The template focuses on the major components of successful technology plan development. Each school's Technology Committee would establish a planning process overview. As it works through the planning process, it does so in light of the mission and vision it has established for the use of technology. The committee then reviews the

current plan for possible implications for the planning process. As a starting point, the school inventories current technology. The committee then develops the goals it wishes to achieve and specifies the action step the school community must take to make these goals a reality. The goals can come out of a study of diocesan goals or can be school goals which align with the School Improvement Plan developed through the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association accreditation process. The committee then examines and lists the professional development opportunities needed to realize the goals of the plan. In light of its technology needs and professional development activities, a technology budget for each of the three years is created. Finally, the committee outlines the methods it will use to evaluate the success and effectiveness of the plan. This evaluation allows the school to make any necessary changes in the plan in order to reach the goals. This dynamic planning process enables the school to use the power of technology to help each student be successful in meeting the objectives of the curriculum.

#### B. Deigning a Parish Catechetical Program to Pass on the Faith in the Twenty-First Century: Challenges, Opportunities and Possibilities

After the Second Vatican Council the Church attempted to find more effective ways to pass on the Catholic faith tradition to children, youth and adults by creating a new genre in Church documents – the catechetical directory – and attempting to shift the primary model for catechetical activity from one centered on young people to an adult-centric model as provided in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. In the decades since these seismic shifts in catechesis, a great deal has been written, and many experiments in catechesis have occurred. In the meantime, the Church has invested a great deal of effort re-emphasizing its doctrinal tradition. Catholicism now stands at the threshold of a new century with tremendous challenges to its mission of passing on the faith. What has been learned in the past ½ century also opens up great opportunities and possibilities. With the National Catechetical Directory as guide, this workshop will explore these opportunities and possibilities within the context of current challenges and will offer suggestions on how to plan an effective catechesis in Catholic parishes of the twenty-first century.

The evening session will provide an overview of Thursday's presentation. The full day session will assist pastors and their staffs in the development of a practical means to address the total catechetical needs of the parish. Registration is requested and may be made through the Office of Religious Education.
