### 3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

#### A. Requirements Reminder

All employees and volunteers who work with children are reminded that they must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program. Some Compliance Checklists are submitted with names but no notation for these two requirements. Some show that persons signed the background questionnaire for the previous Child Protection Policy, but not for the current (2003) Policy. All employees and volunteers must sign the questionnaire, whether or not they work with children. Administrators are reminded that these requirements must be fulfilled for your employees and volunteers.

#### B. Compliance Checklist

Persons responsible for submitting the Compliance Checklist to the Chancery are reminded to call or mail when information is updated for employees/volunteers as requirements are completed (see above). If information is not updated, the data base shows those persons not fully in compliance. Also, please remember to include addresses as there is often more than one person with the same name. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### C. Webchecks at Other Locations

Employees and volunteers who use a Webcheck other than the three diocesan sites must call the Chancery Office at 330-744-8451, ext. 235, to provide their name and location of service. This will ensure that when the BCI report is received at the Chancery it can be forwarded to the proper location.

#### D. Victim Survey

The USCCB is conducting a survey of persons who have been abused by someone representing the Church. The purpose is to find better ways to respond to allegations of sexual abuse and to identify additional ways in which abuse can be prevented.

### 4. PARISH FESTIVALS/GAMBLING REGULATIONS

A list of parish festivals is included with this issue of *Communique*. Also enclosed is the parish festival checklist to ensure proper procedures when conducting festivals.

All gambling done in the context of parish and institutional fundraising requires, by state and federal law, that the games are organized and run by volunteers who are associated with the parish or institution conducting the games. Any exception to this practice will evoke audits from the federal and/or state offices regulating such activity. This is particularly important regarding the popular *Texas Hold-em* games. All aspects of these games – the placement of publicity, dealing the cards, arranging the play area, handling of all the money transactions – must be done by volunteers.
