CHANCERY OFFICE

1. CONFIRMATION

Adult Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation for adults age 18 or older who have not received the sacrament will be celebrated **Sunday, November 19, 2006**, 2:00 p.m. at St. Columba Cathedral. Candidates are to register in their own parishes, and parishes must send the registration forms to the Chancery by November 1. If your parish has not yet sent in the registration forms for your candidates, please do so immediately.

2. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Webcheck (BCI) Reports - Important Notice

When using Webcheck somewhere other than the three diocesan sites, employees and volunteers must ask the operator to send the report to their own location of service (parish, school, institution.).

The Chancery is holding several fingerprint reports for persons whom we are unable to identify because they did not follow this procedure. If your parish or school is missing a report please call Nancy Yuhasz at the Chancery Office, 330-744-8451.

B. Requirements Reminders

1. Fingerprinting - In-Service - Questionnaire

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted by Webcheck and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer, and consequently non-compliance for the diocese.

Sending the Compliance Checklist will also alleviate the problem of unidentified BCI reports as noted above.

In a letter dated October 5, 2006 Archbishop of Baltimore Cardinal William H. Keeler, USCCB Chairman, Committee for Pro-Life Activities states in part:[...With]the Administrative committee,[...] moved that the advice given by the Conference to dioceses regarding voter guides from outside groups should be "to urge parishes not to distribute voter education materials that are not authorized and distributed by the diocese, the state Catholic conference or this conference." This motion was approved without dissent.

D. Criminal Justice Ministries Program has Volunteer Opportunities Available.

At Trumbull Correctional Institution, Leavittsburg, we have an opening for a Site Coordinator. This position coordinates all Catholic ministry in the institution, including volunteer teams, inmate block rounds, and weekly Communion services or the celebration of Eucharist (or coordinating a priest for this). As liaison between the diocese and the prison, this volunteer position is responsible for developing programs such as RCIA, bible study, and self improvement classes as well as weekly invoicing the institution. A priest, deacon, religious or someone with extensive catechetical training is desired.

The second volunteer position is at Ohio State Penitentiary, Youngstown, for weekly distribution of Communion and a weekly bible study in the minimum security camp. This position is best served by a team of two ministers who have the appropriate religious education training for these duties.

1. OFFICE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

A. Security in our Catholic Schools

National news stories send out a clear message to all of us about security in our schools: "Be Prepared." Since 1997, our Diocesan schools have addressed the need to have safe and secure facilities. Consistent with that desire to provide a safe environment in which our children can experience Christ and learn, each of the elementary and secondary schools of the Diocese of Youngstown has in place a "Crisis Management Plan," which is annually reviewed and updated. Schools are encouraged to maintain cooperation and communication with their local emergency management agencies as they plan their response actions in the event of incidents such as intruders, threats, civil disorder, utility failure, contraband, environmental accidents and death in the proximate school community. The safety of our children and the confidence of our parent community are cherished. Planning for that which we hope is the unthinkable is a challenge we face and a task we enthusiastically embrace.

B. Building Within Our Schools

St. Christine School in Youngstown held a groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of a new gymnasium within their building. Blessed Sacrament in Warren is also building a new gymnasium and additional classrooms to their existing building. Staff members and students are excited and looking forward to utilizing the new rooms.

C. Catholic Schools' Report Card

Please be sure to check out the Catholic Schools' Report Card that is included in this month's *Communiqué*. We are very proud of our students and our teachers. The results of these tests are used by the Diocese and the individual schools to identify areas of strength and areas where improvement is needed. This engages schools in strengthening their Catholic identity and improving the conditions for student learning.

C. Second Look Project

As the United States Supreme Court prepares to hear oral arguments in cases challenging the federal partial-birth abortion ban November 8, the U.S. Bishops' Second Look Project hopes to raise public awareness of this issue with a five-week campaign titled "Supreme Court Countdown: Partial-Birth Abortion." The campaign will send 27 "e-cards" each weekday to Congress, news media, and opinion leaders, ending November 8 when oral arguments are scheduled. D. Execution Postponed

Governor Taft has issued a six-month reprieve to death row inmate John Spirko, postponing his execution date until April 17, 2007. Spirko was convicted and sentenced to death for the 1982 kidnapping and murder of Elgin Postmaster Betty Jane Mottinger. E. Plan B

The Plan B "Morning After Pill" is scheduled to be available in pharmacies without a prescription by the end of the year. Plan B poses severe health risks to women and can cause the death of a newly-conceived human being. The decision to carry over-the-counter Plan B rests with each pharmacy. C. Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24, 2006

The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on December 24, 2006. This certainly raises concerns with regard to the liturgical environment and scheduling of Masses. Some parishes may decide to eliminate their last Mass on Sunday morning particularly if it is at a later hour.

In regard to the liturgical environment: Some advance planning will be necessary in order for the integrity of the Advent Sunday to be preserved to some degree, and yet for the parish to be prepared for the Vigil celebrations which follow later in the day. The parish environment and art committee could consider placing a number of elements like trees (with light unlit), wreaths, and the crèche without the Holy Family figures before the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and then completing the environment with poinsettias and the remaining decorative elements.

D. Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, January 1, 2007

The obligation to participate in Mass is abrogated for this Solemnity since it falls on a Monday. It is recommended that the faithful still be given the opportunity to celebrate the holy day.
