### CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

#### 1. Procedures Reminder

Employee and volunteer requirements:

- Authorization & Verification; Acknowledgement

All employees and volunteers must receive a copy of the 2008 Child Protection Policy and sign the Authorization and Verification (pg. 35) and Acknowledgement (pg. 36). The signed forms are to be kept on file at the location of service; the date signed is to be noted on the Compliance Checklist and sent to the Chancery. Do not send the signed forms to the Chancery.

- Fingerprinting and In-Service

Employees and volunteers who work with children, regardless of their level of contact with children, must be fingerprinted and participate in the "Treasured Gifts from God" in-service program. Any Webcheck location may be used. Background reports are to be sent to the location of service.

#### 2. Updating Information

Administrators must submit updates for employees and volunteers as they complete child protection compliance requirements (either on the Status Report or copy of Compliance Checklist previously submitted); and must submit all information for new employees and volunteers on the Compliance Checklist.

(1) Martin Kelly Shanahan, former permanent deacon of the Archdiocese, was dismissed from the clerical state as a result of his having abandoned the Catholic Church and seeking "priestly ordination" from a female bishop of the Apostolic Catholic Orthodox Church, and attempting to administer the sacraments.

(2) A group calling itself the "Catholic Coalition for Church Reform" is planning a "synod" in 2010 in the Archdiocese. This synod is not being conducted under the auspices of the Archdiocese, the Roman Catholic Church, or any entity or organization affiliated therewith; and the group, synod and those involved are not acting for, or entities of, the Archdiocese or the Church. The Archdiocese has cautioned members of the faithful who intend to involve themselves with the Coalition or the synod that some issues on which the Coalition or synod may seek change may involve the magisterial teachings of the Church, and of the need to avoid contrary doctrines.
