3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Requirements Reminders

1. Fingerprinting and In-Service

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the above requirements.

3. Webchecks at Other Locations

If using a Webcheck site other than the three diocesan sites, please call the Chancery at 330-744-8451, ext. 235, with name and location of service to ensure that your BCI report is forwarded to the proper location.

B. USCCB Compliance Audit

The Diocese of Youngstown had our third compliance audit the week of September 26. The auditors determined that persons who work with children and have not yet been fingerprinted and/or participated in an in-service must complete these two requirements before the diocese will be considered compliant. The diocese was issued two "required actions" to ensure that all persons who work with children have been fingerprinted and participated in an in-service program. We must report back to the auditors providing updated information on these numbers. If persons currently serving in our parishes and schools have not completed these requirements by November 15, 2005, the diocese will be found "non-compliant" in the USCCB's national report.

Tribunal

Prohibitions

Priests, Deacons and Pastoral Ministers preparing parties for marriage should take careful notice of the Decree of Matrimonial Invalidity issued by the Tribunal. If on the Decree of Matrimonial Invalidity there is given a Prohibition, contact the Tribunal immediately so that the Tribunal may give proper assistance in directing the marital preparation.

A subsequent letter must be sent confirming that the concerns in the Prohibition have been addressed. At that time the Tribunal will issue a new Decree lifting the Prohibition.
