### **C. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY**

#### **1. Standards of Ministerial Behavior**

An additional component of the diocesan *Child Protection Policy* is a new document, Standards of Ministerial Behavior for Clergy, Employees and Volunteers. All clergy, employees and volunteers in the diocese will receive a copy of the Standards and sign the acknowledgement form. The Standards will be distributed through various department meetings and/or by mail.

Pastors, principals, administrators and others responsible for Child Protection Policy compliance are asked to distribute the Standards to all employees and volunteers, collect the acknowledgement forms, and send either the new Compliance Checklist or the simple name/address/date signed form to the Chancery.

If employees and volunteers have not received a copy of the Standards, please check with your administrator or call Nancy Yuhasz at 330-744-8451, ext. 235.

#### **2. Webcheck**

##### **a. New Location**

Please note that the Webcheck site at St. Mary Parish in Orwell has been moved. The new location is St. Patrick Parish in Kent. Please call for an appointment at 330-677-4453.

## b. Procedure

When using Webcheck somewhere other than the three diocesan sites, employees and volunteers must ask the operator to send the report to their own location of service (parish, school, institution). Catholic school teachers' reports must be sent to the Office of Catholic Schools.

## c. Timeframe

We have received notice from the Ohio BCI & I that due to increased demand for background check services, most results will be completed in 7 to 10 business days rather than the previous 48 hour timeframe. Please keep this in mind when planning to be fingerprinted for employment or volunteer service.

## 3. Requirements Reminders

a. Fingerprinting - In-Service - Questionnaire - Standards

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted for a background check and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the Background Questionnaire and Applicant's Certification, and the new Standards acknowledgement, whether or not they work with children.

b. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer, and consequently non-compliance for the diocese.

Please remember that the only way compliance is entered into the diocesan data base is from information sent in from parishes, schools and institutions. You must tell us!

## PASTORAL AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

### A. OFFICE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

#### 1. Asbestos Management Requirements for Diocesan Schools

School buildings that may be included in a parish renovation plan need to be carefully considered. Each school building in the diocese has been inspected for asbestos and has developed a management plan that complies with EPA regulations. Building principals have been provided with a "checklist" that must be completed when any of the material in the building that appears on the management plan is scheduled to be disturbed. Additionally, when weather, flood or equipment failures cause any of the listed material to be damaged, the checklist must be employed to assure that the building remains in compliance. #### 2. Athletic Teams Below the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade

This is a reminder to schools that Ohio law prohibits schools from sponsoring interscholastic teams below the 7<sup>th</sup> grade. If teams of students in grades lower than 7<sup>th</sup> are organized, they are parish teams, not under the sponsorship of the school. Typically, these parish teams are under the direct supervision of the pastor or his delegate and are open to all students in the parish. ## 3. Confirmation Preparation for Practicing Catholic Adults

Bishop George V. Murry, S.J., will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for practicing Catholic adults (over 18 years of age) on **Sunday, November 25, 2007**, at 2:00 p.m. Persons eligible to celebrate this sacrament must be suitably prepared through their parish or through the diocesan sponsored preparation session.

## 4. Required Child Protection In-Service

All persons working or volunteering with children and adolescents are required to participate in an in-service for compliance with The Diocese of Youngstown Child Protection Policy. "Treasured Gifts from God: Protecting Our Children" provides an overview of the policy expectations, the signs and symptoms of child abuse and neglect and familiarity with the responsibilities to create and maintain safe environments for children and youth.

Administrators who would like to provide the in-service locally must complete the Program Prospectus Form (F-2.3 in the Directory for Catechesis) and send it to the Office of Religious Education at least four weeks before the program date.
