3. CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

A. Webcheck (BCI) Reports

1. Procedure

Please remember that employees and volunteers who use a Webcheck somewhere other than the three diocesan sites must ask the operator to send their report to their own supervisor (pastor, principal, DRE, etc.) Reminder: Catholic school teachers must use the diocesan Webcheck sites.

2. Unidentified Reports

The Chancery is holding several fingerprint reports for persons whom we are unable to identify. If your parish or school is missing a report please call Nancy Yuhasz at the Chancery Office, 330-744-8451.

B. Requirements Reminders

1. Fingerprinting - In-Service - Questionnaire

All employees and volunteers who work with children must be fingerprinted by Webcheck and participate in an in-service program. All employees and volunteers must sign the background questionnaire whether or not they work with children.

2. Compliance Checklist

The Checklist must be updated and sent to the Chancery as employees and volunteers complete the requirements. Failure to complete the requirements, and/or failure to update the Checklist, results in non-compliance for the employee or volunteer, and consequently non-compliance for the diocese.

Sending the Compliance Checklist will also alleviate the problem of unidentified BCI reports as noted above.

CANONICAL SERVICES

In-Service Scheduled

Currently, the Tribunal is scheduling another in-service at their offices in Youngstown on **Tuesday, October 17, 2006**, at 1:00 p.m. Several more registrants are needed to schedule a session in Canton. The Tribunal will be contacting any remaining registrants who are on file and who have been unable to attend prior sessions. Interested parties, who have not already registered or who need a "refresher," should call the Tribunal as soon as possible at (330) 744-8451, ext. 252.

Since May of 2004, the Tribunal staff has made available this ongoing, in-service for pastors, associates, deacons, religious, directors of religious education, religious education coordinators and counselors in order to prepare them in facilitating pleas for nullity for persons within the community whose marriages have broken down and who may be seeking a second union recognized by the Church. The in-service focuses on preparation of case histories, compilation of documents, witnesses and determining of the appropriate grounds of nullity.

The response to the ongoing, in-service program has been encouraging. Eight sessions have been held since the inception of the program and approximately 75 registrants have had the opportunity to participate. Size of the in-service is in small groups of between 8-12 participants and generally runs approximately two hours. The in-service is offered at either the offices of the Tribunal of the Diocese of Youngstown or at a parish in the Canton area.

1. OFFICE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

A. Religious In-Service

The administrators from our Catholic Schools will attend a religious retreat on **October 5-6**. Guest speaker is Dr. Elinor R. Ford, a renowned international speaker.
